

Privacy statement regarding the website of the EUISS

Purpose

Data are collected to enable the EUISS to understand better which are the most popular topics and pages on its website, by analysing data on visits to, and downloads from, the website.

Data Controller

The Data Controller is the EUISS and specifically the Public Information Officer.

Legal Basis

The legal basis of the processing operation is the establishment of the EUISS.

Data categories

Data subjects are all individuals who visit the EUISS website.

For every visit on the website, we store: the website from which the visit originated, the parts of our site visited, the date, time and duration of the visit, IP address (anonymised), and information from the device (device type, operating system, screen resolution, language, country you are located in, and web browser) used during the visit. The analytics tool used is Matomo and the data are stored in servers managed by the EUISS.

Recipients of the data

Data are handled by the EUISS staff dealing with communications and outreach.

Right of access, rectification, blocking and erasure

Data subjects requesting to access, rectify, block or erase their data shall contact the EUISS, via the online contact form. You can also write to the EUISS data protection officer via the online contact form if there are any difficulties or questions regarding the processing. Data subjects have also the right to have recourse at any time to the European Data Protection Supervisor:

Data retention policy

Anonymised and aggregated data are stored for an indefinite period.

Website

The EUISS website uses cookies (small data files transferred onto computers or devices by websites) for record-keeping purposes and to enhance functionality on the site. You may deactivate or restrict the transmission of cookies by changing the settings of your web browser. Cookies that are already stored may be deleted at any time.

Opting out

By default, the browsing experience of website visitors is tracked in order to produce anonymised statistics. You may choose not to be tracked (opt-out). If you change your mind, you can choose to be tracked again (opt-in). If you choose to opt-out, you will receive an opt-out cookie so that your decision is remembered. If you regularly delete your cookies, you will need to opt-out each time you delete them.

Do Not Track

Do Not Track (DNT) is a web browser setting that requests that a web application disable its tracking of an individual user. When you choose to turn on the DNT setting in your browser, your browser sends a special signal to websites, analytics companies, ad networks, plug in providers, and other web services you encounter while browsing to stop tracking your activity. The EUISS website fully respects the DNT settings of your browser.
